FEATURE ARTICLE - TOURING AMERICA in 1957. Recently, Aucklander, Rex Findlay sent me a splendid article titled 'Touring America in 1957'. This is Part Three with more photos and captions, all self-explanatory. Like all good photos, a great picture can 'tell a thousands words' so let the pictures do the talking! Great memories in colour as we look at when 'those were the days! Ed

In Atlantic City, New Jersey, the Atlantic shore drew thousands of people every weekend to their famous boardwalk, and to the Steel Pier where they could watch Arabian stallions dive from a 60 foot high platform into the salty water. At that time, there were no casinos, and the ocean was the biggest attraction. Besides the diving horses, the six story tall elephant named Lucy, constructed of wood and tin in 1861 in nearby Margate was a big thrill for kids. Since there were no big resorts, small motels flourished. Resorts International opened the first casino in 1978 and everything changed.



New Yorkers flocked to Coney Island when the summer months arrived. "Down the shore" the boardwalk attracted hundreds of thousands of people and the sand was barely visible for the colorful bloom of beach umbrellas. Iconic Nathan's HotDog holds a hot dog eating contest every year on Independence Day. Legend has it that the contest started in 1916. In 2021, a hundred and five years later, the winner downed 76 dogs in ten minutes.

The expanding mobility of Americans and new interstate freeways spawned the exponential growth of the MO-TEL. All across the United States, roadside motor inns that provided travelers with economical lodging popped up along every highway. Startup companies with names like Holiday Inn, Ramada Inn, Howard Johnson's, and Rodeway Inn began to buy up local Ma and Pa motels and offer upgrades like TV and air conditioning.

America's sports car, the Chevrolet Corvette, made its debut in 1953. In 1955, the 150 horsepower Blue Flame six cylinder inline engine was replaced by the V8. In 1957, the first solid lifter, fuel injected engines were released, making 283 horsepower from a displacement of 283 cubic inches. Girls loved the Corvettes more than the guys that drove 'em.

It is said that the first automobile race happened the day the second car was made. Americans, more than any nation other than, perhaps, Italy, love racing cars, and by the mid-50s, street racing was commonplace. This straight line form of racing became known as "drag racing" since it started on the main streets, or "main drags" of nearly every town. Seeing a need for safety and sanctioned timing of these races, pioneer Wally Parks formed the National Hot Rod Association in 1951 in Southern California. NHRA took hold on dry lake beds in the West, but it was several years before sanctioned quarter mile drag strips appeared in the rest of the country. On the East Coast, the beach at Daytona, Florida was a summer drag racing venue where hundreds of drivers would show up, often in a car that just came from the dealer showroom, to see what it would do. NHRA drag racing now draws the largest crowds in motor racing with 11,000 horsepower top fuel dragsters reaching speeds in excess of 335 mph in under 4 seconds.



Before Tony Bennett topped the charts with his song "I Left My Heart in San Francisco" in 1962, the beautiful City by the Bay was drawing tourists from all over the world. Fisherman's Wharf, Chinatown, the cable cars, winding Lombard Street, the "painted ladies" Victorian houses, and the Golden Gate Bridge were beckoning visitors. A coat was advised. Mark Twain said, "The coldest winter I ever spent was a summer in San Francisco."

Midland American Auto Club Kilbeggan 2022 All-American Car Truck & Bike Show Report

The Midland American Auto Club had a very successful All-American Car Truck & Bike show on Sunday 24th April 2022 in Kilbeggan Co. Westmeath. This is the only All-American show of the year in Ireland which is exclusively American vehicles and celebrates all that is good about American transport. After a 3 year absence almost a record number of American vehicles turned up; huge 18 wheeler Peterbilt & Kenworth trucks, muscle cars, Mustangs, Corvettes, big Cadillacs, Lincolns and Buicks, many many pick up trucks, Chevrolet day vans and Harley Davidson motorcycles. American cars, vans, trucks and bikes came from all over the island of Ireland – from Belfast, Cork, Dublin and the West. Cars came over from England and Wales too to join in the party. The specialist American cars were out in force too; Smokey & the Bandit Trans Ams, Starsky & Hutch red & white Ford Torinos, black & white police cars, lowriding station wagons, forties Hudsons & Studebakers, thirties hot rods and a Ghostbusters 1959 ambulance. The Club was also very pleased by the number of newer American vehicles that came to the show; demonstrating that the American car scene in Ireland has a healthy future.

The sunny day brought out the visiting public in good numbers also, many of whom had heard about the show in magazines, local newspapers, on the radio and from social media. As well as being a celebration of American culture, the show paid tribute to those who had lost their lives throughout the pandemic, some of which were club members, and paid tribute and a big thank you to the essential and emergency services workers over the past 3 years with a celebratory "Sound of Remembrance" – a sound off of car & truck horns, wailing emergency vehicle sirens, revving engines and barking exhausts. There was lots to see and do; from marvelling at the 3 huge American fire engines, one of which was fresh in from New York, had served in 911 and had a 100 foot high ladder, which looked amazing even only half-extended. People listened to the informative interviews with the owner explaining all about the history and capability of the fire engines with interest – pumping 100 gallons a minute! There was an increased number of stands selling automotive related and vintage items, which drew big crowds all day long. Gourmet coffee, cakes, hamburgers and corn dogs were on hand to sample whilst taking a break from seeing all the cars, trucks, vans and bikes. There were rides and entertainment for the little ones too. As well as a bucking bronco for those budding cowboys and cowgirls who were brave enough! "We always try to put on a great show, with lots to see and do for the whole family. If the weather is with us we always have a good show and this year was no exception. We are also pleased to do our bit for the economy of Westmeath and Offaly by filling the local hotels and B&Bs with visitors from around Ireland and the UK. The quality of American vehicles goes up and up each year with many It is good to connect with new owners as

well as old friends once again" said Joe Keenan the Midland American Auto Club chairman. "We look forward to welcoming everybody back next year on the last weekend of April before the Bank Holiday; 23rd April 2023." [Many thanks for your terrific report Nick. 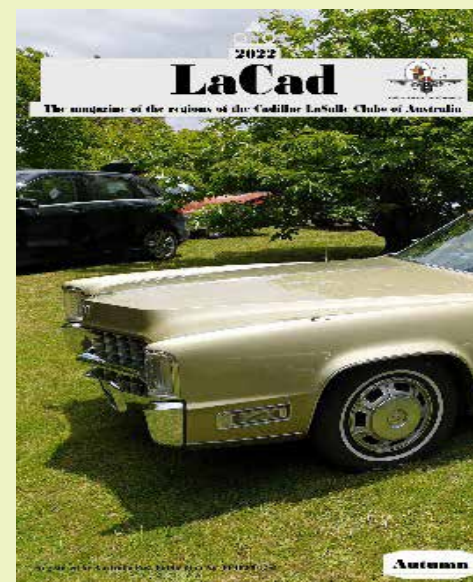
MORE USA - From the CLC USA Webmaster

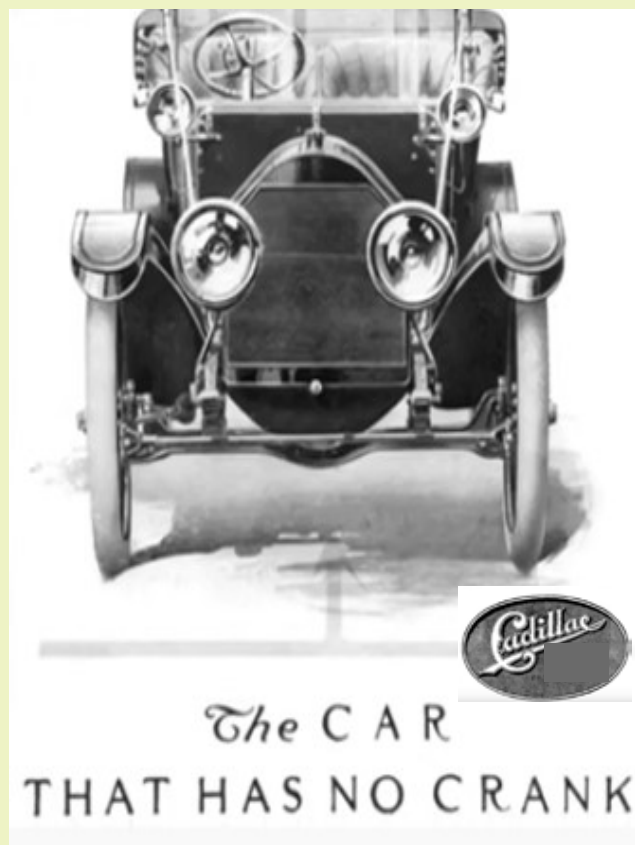

I was surprised to see a recent article from my *Old Cars* feed about an NZ Cadillac. here's what the article had to say: New Zealand funeral director Simon Manning's dream hearse, a 1959 Cadillac, had eight years of restoration before it began service in New Zealand during the southern hemisphere's past winter. Simon says every part of the American import received attention in the restoration, right down to the last nut and bolt. The hearse's first public appearance in New Zealand was at Moonshine Rod and Custom Club's American Vehicle Day in February 2021. While the hearse looked ready for work, spectators couldn't see was required before the vehicle became ready to join the team at Harbour City Funeral Homes, where it is now used in funeral services. 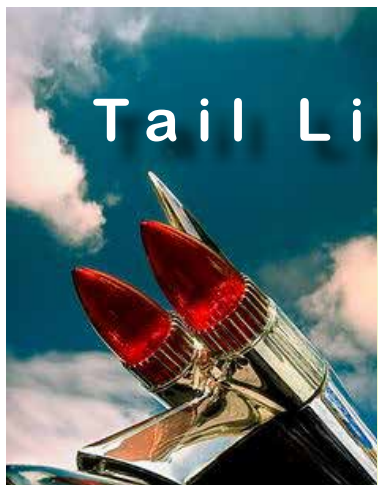
