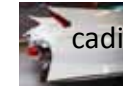

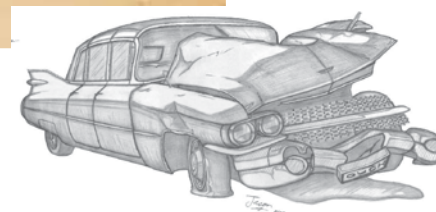
Until next month, stay warm Kiwis as the first Antarctic chill descends over the country for an early start to winter...brrrrrr! Ron :)

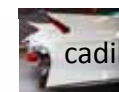




## Sixty-topia!

## Tripping Around...Melbourne and beyond, 17th to 20th...

Well what another great time we had, I mean to say – this is Steve and my second joint attendance at an Australian Grand Nationals event and my third. We keep telling fellow Kiwis ‘come along’ but until you do, you will never understand just how much fun they are! The hospitality, the organised events, and the great accommodation we stay in, the many Cadillacs we ride in, the wonderfully interesting places we visit and see – the terrific people we meet, mix and mingle with.

So here we are in Renmark, a small tourist town perched alongside the great Murray River. The HQ for this year’s Nationals was at the ‘Big 4 Holiday Park’, a huge complex of tent sites to modern cabins of all sizes and calibre – something to suit everyone. The manager told me they can cater for around 1500 people at peak times and the well-oiled machine runs day and night ensuring everyone enjoys a safe, clean and well catered for stay. The place is perfect for 90+ twenty-foot Cadillacs and LaSalles! If a place like this can accommodate tandem caravans and lengthy campervans/ buses – parking Caddies was a cinch!

The nearby river means there’s water close by for irrigation and green grass of which there was plenty amongst the acrid red-earth and ample of that when without warning the wind whips up an instant dust storm in a few seconds!

### Event Day One – Wednesday 21st March:

Event Registration opened. Time to get a goodie bag and engage with a few familiar faces. For some, there was an ‘Early bird’ run if one wanted whilst others had a free afternoon, checking out town – getting breakfast and refreshment supplies – as the days ahead will be busy and very, very thirsty! (I can hear Steve now saying ‘I’ll drink to that...!’) Come 5.30pm it’s the ‘Welcome BBQ’ at a designated spot set up by the South Australian State, our CLC event hosts. A time to ‘mix and mingle’ – meeting old friends and acquaint with new ones. The Ozzies (rhymes with mozzies) are impressed to learn that we took time out to participate (of course we were there to enjoy ourselves on behalf of all those that couldn’t make it!). A few Americans turned up as well and one German – always great to hear Caddy events attract an International visitor or two! First late night but not to worry, we don’t depart until 8am...! Steve and I bunked down in our cabin (literally – Steve and I each had bunks – he is such a quiet sleeper – I never heard a thing!) with Victorian member Greg Short, a former President of their State in another room. A good guy and plenty informative – there is nothing or few people he doesn’t know!

## Tripping Around...Renmark and beyond, Event Day One and on...

### Event Day Two – Thursday 22nd March:

Yes, you've got to rise at 6am to get ready, three of us to have breakfast, brush the 'fangs' and apply some sunscreen for it will be another warm day (in the 30s most days). We head down to the designated starting area at about 7.45am. There are already plenty of nice Caddies and a few LaSalle's there already. Unlike today's 'non-coloured automobiles' these Caddies come from a time when there were various shades of red, pink, blues, greens, mauves, peachy tones, gold, bronze, black and a few whites – in fact consensus is that the Cadillac is one of the few cars that actually look good in white. The chrome of course helps and there's even some with gold plated trim – check out the many photos over the next few issues. As visitors, we don't have a Caddy ourselves but there are plenty of members eager to offer a ride in their gleaming chariot! Greg takes his own car but Steve and I hitch a ride. The convoy departs to a local park to watch the Paringa Bridge 'Lock' open where a local touristy River boat laden with lucky Caddy members who won a draw to take a ride – albeit they had to leave the park at 6.45am!

Whilst parked up, a member's son's 'drone' buzzed overhead and it will be a regular feature in the sky over the event, shooting video with a promise for everyone to access footage at a later date. We make our way to the Wilkadene Woolshed Brewery for lunch. This is some 16km out in the country and it feels like the mid-30s by time we get there. The brewery is situated within a historic woolshed site serving up craft beers, cider and the like. There are vendors on site serving up 'cooked as you wait' pizzas (in a mobile pizza oven) and chicken options. From the queues of people, I reckon one hundred plus pizzas must have been consumed that day and hundreds of litres of cool refreshments! Mid-afternoon we hit the road back to our base. There are two options that evening, either a 'Party River Cruise' or an outdoors movie. We opt for the Elvis has left the building movie starring a youthful Kim Bassinger and John Cusack. The star car is a pink Eldo. It's a funny 90 minute movie and the evening is so mild there's no need for thermals!

The evenings are so balmy one has to keep hydrated, well that's Steve's excuse and he's sticking to it – cheers! It's only a short walk back to the cabin under starry skies – Steve thought he'd drunk too much and was seeing stars!

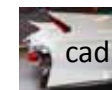
