Years in the making, the end result was not only a trophy-reward-winning example but the pleasure of driving it home with a back seat full of the 'booty' he hauled as a result of his efforts. Hi Ron here is a little story on how the v-16 came about

"Having completed my 4th Cadillac ground up restoration in 1990, I felt lost something to do, I should have said no more to cars...but like a true restorer I started looking for the Ultimate Vintage Cadillac (in my opinion) a SIXTEEN CYLINDER PHAETON

I searched Hemmings Motor News, Auctions etc, even No 4 condition were \$300,000 and No 1 were asking \$900,000 if you could find one and this was way out of my league. On thinking about it my restoration projects had been a 20-year apprenticeship to me, if not monetary gain it had given me the know-how to tackle any Cadillac restoration! So I started looking at Hemming's etc. for parts cars and parts. I bought any 30's V-16 parts I found or could afford. I also found V-16 parts - very hard to find, not like V8 parts, and this was all before the Internet. Back then it was all done by phone and mail.

I located the REMAINS of a wrecked Phaeton chassis with original cowl tag body No 26 in California. After purchasing the chassis I also purchased a 7 passenger limo parts car from Minnesota and a 5-passenger sedan from New Hampshire. Once the cars arrived I realised both were unsuitable as the bodies were totally different. The bonnets, doors, body even the valence was straight not curved, so back to the drawing board and those cars had to be sold. One went to Melbourne the other stayed in Sydney to be restored.

I then started my 11-year 'Ground up' restoration after a quick trip to the States for photos and to measure up a V16 Phaeton and then back home to get stuck into it. [continued next page]



I then had some new wood-work done to the Phaeton chassis and some new metal panels to exact specifications as per the original. The bonnet is aluminium and the sides are steel, the cowl is steel as are the doors. The whole real tub is steel as per the original.

All missing parts were sourced from the USA as there were no V16 parts in Australia at this time. The parts I couldn't find I had to have made e.g. Right hand side steering box. Three wooden patterns had to be made first, then cast in SG Steel and machined. Then I had to find someone who could make the hour glass type worm & sector, locate obsolete roller bearings, assemble, adjust, test and paint. This one job took just over 2 years alone.

The front windscreen was a similar job, a wooden pattern had to be made, then cast in bronze, polished and machined, fill casting holes, chromed and glassed - another 2 years and this is only 2 stories of the 11 year resto!

But when it is all finished you completely forget about the thousands of hours and the bottomless pit of \$\$\$ spent, especially when you are sitting behind the wheel driving the only running V16 Phaeton in the Southern Hemisphere to its first show and then drive home with a back seat full of trophies ...that day I had trouble getting myself in the car as I was feeling at least a foot taller. My labour of love was finally finished.

The trophies won:

- 2004 Shannon's Eastern Creek Concourse "First in Class"
- 2006 Penrith Panthers GM Day "Car of the Day"
- 2006 Castle Hill All American Day "Car of the Day"+1st Paint Stock+1st Interior Stock+1st Engine Bay Stock

But the most exciting time I have had was when I was asked to drive the V16 in a movie ..."The Great Gatsby" which involved 4 days on set at Manly (Sydney, Australia) for a night time scene and Fox Studios in Sydney with the Duesenbergs's and Rolls in November 2011. The movie is due to premier in June 2013

The shed started as room for a four cars in 1990 and was later expanded to house eight cars. They later had the air conditioned man-cave put in which cut the car space back to six. The 1967 Cadillac Convertible, 1969 Cadillac Hearse, 1988 Cadillac Eldorado, 1963 EJ Holden and a 1963 105E Ford Anglia reside there, along with Sue's car. They bought the 1963 Rowe-AMI jukebox in 1983 with thoughts of eventually making the playroom. The jukebox holds one hundred 45rpm records and they have at least another 250 to put in when they need a change. Most are late 1950's through to the 1960's. Is there any other music asks Val?

The 1976 and 1979 pinball machines were bought years ago along with an original table top space invaders machine. The race machine, 'Final Lap', did not work but thanks to eBay a couple of second hand game boards solved the problem. It's good to have these games out of storage and in use again.

The Shell beer fridge stands next to the juke box. There is a mirror ball and some neon signs to add to the atmosphere also. Sue tiled the floor and painted the walls.

On the wall there are photos from Val's racing days. In the early 1970's Val did a bit of rallying in a V8 Monaro. He also did some drag racing in a Fiat Bodied Altered along with the Monaro. He then raced speedway Sedans till the mid 1980's and a year in HQ racing at Lakeside.

Usually you'll find Val in the man-cave on a Saturday and/or Sunday afternoon with a mate or two having rum. They have a large hanging gong from Bali standing outside the door for Sue or any other female to hit before entering just in case there is a bit of "men" language going on while watching TV - mainly any car racing!

Val Sharp has been a member of the Cadillac Club since 1984, a foundation member and now a life member of the Queensland club. He is also the treasurer of the Australia and Queensland clubs.

Looking back in time..1940 and 1941

Reading through the events of these early times, there is some uncanny similarities of what the world is going through today. At time of writing this, the USA is seriously near the fiscal cliff and over the next few weeks the US maybe in again, recession. The question is, will the world follow?

1940 WWII sees the printing of money by the Fed for the re-arming of US forces thereby easing the Great Depression resulting in more Americans working and earning, paying tax and creating the 'money-go-round' in-turn fueling the economy. A worker in a new factory could earn up to \$1250 pa.. Germany invades France resulting in Germany and Italy controlling most of Western Europe except for England. The US had not yet officially entered the WW and 'State-side' Americans felt better about things than they had for over a dozen years resulting in the making of some great movies including "Gone With the Wind". Jazz sounds were popular music of the day from the likes of Benny Goodman and Count Basie. Nylon stockings invented the previous year were all the rage with women, FDR was elected for a third term. Americans started to believe they should help Britain in it's fight for survival with Germany and the first peacetime draft occurred in September 1940 having ominous future overtones. Britain was being bombed incessantly and many believed it may only be a matter of time before America would be involved.

- Dunkirk nine day evacuation begins of British Expeditionary Force

- Axis Powers win The Battle Of France and Take control of Paris
- Following the German invasion and occupation of France, Britain opened fire on the French fleet killing 1,200 French sailors
- The battle of Britain begins with the German Luftwaffe attempting gain air superiority over the Royal Air Force (RAF),
- Winston Churchill makes a number of speeches after becoming Prime Minister that inspire the British People "We Shall Fight Them On The Beaches.....", and "Never in the field of human conflict was so much..."
- The Queen Mary, The Mauritania and The Queen Elizabeth Ocean Liners are put into service as troop carriers.
- The bombing of cities in England including Coventry and London leads to the bombing of Hamburg and other cities in Germany
- Germany starts it's Blitz on London on 300 German bombers in the first of 57 consecutive nights of bombing
- Selective Training and Service Act signed into law as first peacetime military draft in United States history

Did anything other events happen?

- Franklin D. Roosevelt wins the election and becomes the United States' first third-term president.
- US 40-hour working week goes into effect
- Churchill was appointed Prime Minister and formed an all-party government
- Race Riots in Chicago, Harlem, Los Angeles and Detroit
- Leon Trotsky the Russian revolutionary is assassinated in Mexico
- Life magazine costs 10 cents
- Nylon Stockings go on sale

1941 War in Europe continues to dominate world affairs but a new threat was growing that would eventually involve America. British Prime Minister Winston Churchill addressed the joint session of congress asking for help in the form of Arms, but it's 'business as usual' in the US with 2 great movies produced that year - "Citizen Kane" and "Dumbo". US teenagers became fashion conscious , also drive in Movies and drive in fast food grow in popularity. On December 7th 1941 the US was attacked by the Japanese at Pearl Harbour in Hawaii resulting in more than 2400 American servicemen killed that day and America entered the war . And with neutrality ended some 950 tanks were sent to Britain together with food, trucks, guns and ammunition.

- War in Europe escalates with more countries joining on one side or the other resulting in large number of civilian casualties on both sides due to bombing
- North Atlantic - German battleship Bismarck sinks HMS Hood ('pride of the Royal Navy') killing all but three crewman. Fairey Swordfish aircraft from the carrier HMS Ark Royal fatally cripple the German battleship Bismarck in torpedo attack and Navy Warships sink the Bismarck
- Germany attacks Soviet Union, begins an all-out offensive on Moscow.
- HMS Ark Royal torpedoed by a German U-boat
- German Aircraft sink a Russian Hospital Ship killing 7,000

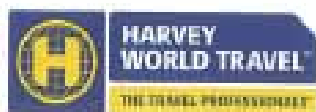
