Recently I had a conversation with Auckland Member, Steve Barker about starting issues with one of his old cars.

He told me that a new device called a 'Fast' electronic ignition system (made by a member of the *Edelbrock* family of companies) had curred one other of his cars and he is keen to use it again.

Steve went on to say "Hi Ron, yes, that's the one. I run an MSD on my '39 coupe, and Pertronix on the Riviera and Eldorado.

My Desoto was one of the hardest cars to start that I've ever owned. I gave the distributor, cap and leads to Steve Moore of Muthas magnetos and he converted it to "Fast" electronic system. There is a separate box which we concealed under the battery box. The Desoto is now my best starting car. You barely hear the starter motor. I will eventually convert the whole fleet to "Fast", as issues arise. Steve Moore advises that he has never had a failure in

the hundreds that he has fitted. I understand a number of these installations have been replacements for other failing brands. Cheers, Steve Barker". [Thanks Steve, a great heads-up that many a member might look into. Steve Moore's details are below:



#### Welcome to LaSalle

It is surprising, how many members (and non) I come across who have no idea how LaSalle fits into the Cadillac family.

To turn back in time, Cadillac, had been formed from the remains of the Henry Ford Company in 1902 and hence this is why we are part of the 'Ford Family Tree', not once but twice (read next column). And Cadillac itself was purchased by GM in June 1909. GM was created by the entrepreneur, Billy Durant.

LaSalle was introduced by GM for the 1927 model year to supplement Cadillac. It was one of the many new "companion cars" that were introduced by GM and some other car companies as a 'lower-cost' brand to boost the 'parent car company's' coffers.

Like the Cadillac name (a French explorer, chosen by company founder, Henry Leland), LaSalle too was a famous French explorer. Robert de La Salle was best remembered for sailing the length of the Mississippi River and claiming the lands around it for France, thus creating the territory of Louisiana, which he had named La Louisiane after King Louis XIV.

The companion makes were introduced to supplement their 'parent brands'. Hence LaSalle, in the 1927 model year for Cadillac; Marquette, in 1929/1930 for Buick; Pontiac, in 1926 for (then) Oakland; and Viking, in 1929 for Oldsmobile. Chevrolet, did not receive a companion make. With the exception of Viking, each of the companion makes were price-slotted below their "parent make pricing structure". However the program is generally considered a failure. Sales of Vikings and Marquettes were low during the Great Depression and the brands were discontinued by 1931. LaSalle lasted longer, weathering the Depression until it too ceased production after 1940\*. Pontiac's immense popularity led to the discontinuation of Oakland after 1931 whereby Pontiac continued for another 70+ years until its discontinuation in 2010 in the aftermath of the Great Recession in which the great GM itself sufferred significant headwinds! \*Some commentaries suggest that LaSalle was so successful and loved, it took too many sales away from Cadillac and became a threat to the parent brand and was axed as a result!

Two other car companies saw fit to launch a 'companion car' at the time. REO launched the 'Wolverine' in 1928 but it only lasted two years. Marmon also had a 'Little Marmon' but it too faded.

It is well known that the LaSalle actually kept Cadillac afloat in the depression years when most high-end Marques succumbed to the Depression. During the thirties, Duesenburg, Pierce-Arrow, Cord, Marmon and many others simply evaporated.

Two other well known marque identies of the time, Lincoln and Packard survived the 1930s.

Henry Leland, founder of Cadillac left the company around 1915/17 to form 'Lincoln', named after former US President Abraham Lincoln (Leland apparently loved heroes!). Like Cadillac, it too was a high-end calibre car and in the 1920s Lincoln was acquired by Edsel Ford of The Ford Motor Company so that the brand had a recognised luxury example amongst its ranks. Lincoln was Fords "Cadillac!" The funny thing was though, both Cadillac and Lincoln were created by one man, Henry Leland! Hence, another 'branch' grew on the Ford Family Tree! Meanwhile, Packard struggled through the decades finally merging with Studebaker and AMC in the 1950s where the name finally came to an end. Ed.




