





Our Global Cadillac Family from NZ and around the world!


AUSTRALIA - As a Global Cadillac Family we are so blessed to have such a great array of personalities in our club that also possess such special talents like Cadillac historic knowledge (Yann Saunders); poetry (Steve Gill) and writing great stories (Steve Westmacott - aka, 'The Cowboy'). It is the latter, ('The Cowboy') who emailed me recently with a terrific story all about the number fifty (50) and whether he had the foresight to consider our upcoming 50th, I am not sure, but what I do know is that it's a terrific Aussie yarn that only a fair dinkum cobber like 'The Cowboy' could pen! Good on yer mate! Appreciate it. Best regards to you, Helen and Cody - Ed.

Fifty-Fifty - I wanted to write a Cadillac story with a 50th theme. Easy, I can do that. But, my style is cryptic and not for the average 'See Spot Run' reader. Here's my enigmatic take on a 50th thread. In 1992 I was 39 years old and purchased a 1961 Cadillac coupe that had travelled 76,000 miles in its 31 year life; paying \$9,000 for the car, \$2,000 for a respray + four tyres and a single pipe stainless steel exhaust. In 1992 I had two sons (two more followed in subsequent years) and that initial cheeky pair decided as soon as they saw our big new family boat to call her Lucy. Lucy proved to be a comfy and reliable old girl that went out gallivanting most weekends as this was in a time before Conditional Historic registration and the honesty system of 90 day log books. After a handful of years of never missing a beat we decided on a three day weekend jaunt to do some Vogue style modelling with our Cadillac at a car show in Mount Gambier – a round trip of 900 kilometres. On our journey we passed through the town of Kingston and stumbled on Larry the Lobster. AKA The Big Lobster. My eldest son Christopher, today a successful banking executive, posed



GM Australia and New Zealand

has a new boss. Australian Jess Bala is taking the reins as managing director from September 1, 2023, replacing Marc Ebolo. This will see her lead operations across both countries, including GM Specialty Vehicles, Isuzu New Zealand, Chevrolet Racing, and GM's customer care and aftersales services including Holden Aftersales. Mr Ebolo is moving to the role of sales director for GM Middle East, based in Dubai. Ms Bala steps into the role after having served most recently as director of global product planning and product strategy for Cadillac, which saw her play a central role in the luxury brand's transition to being electric-only by 2030. Her career started at Holden in 2009 according to her LinkedIn, where she went on to work in product planning. She moved to Detroit in 2013, and has served in various product roles including her most recent post at Cadillac. "Jess is a highly experienced GM professional who has 15+ years leading and implementing winning product strategies, including the introduction, and positioning of electric vehicles in both retail and commercial markets," said Ernesto Ortiz, president and managing director of GM's Strategic Markets, Alliances and Distributors region, which includes Australia and New Zealand. "Australia and New Zealand are critical markets in GM's international strategy and Jess' appointment comes at an important time in the operation, with further opportunity and transformation for the business on the horizon." Ms Bala oversaw the introduction of the Cadillac Lyriq in North America and China. GMSV has remained coy on the prospect of selling electric vehicles in Australia, and currently sells only the Chevrolet Corvette and Silverado with big V8 engines. There have been signs, however, the company could look to import electric Cadillacs. First a trademark filing appeared on IP Australia for the Cadillac Lyriq last year, which has also been spied in right-hand drive. Subsequently, two more trademark filings appeared in July: one for the smaller Optiq, the other for the larger Escalade IQ. Senior members of the General Motors team in Australia told CarExpert earlier this year there's "a lot of exciting stuff coming this year". When it comes to Cadillac, a spokesperson for General Motors simply said "stay tuned". Cadillac last officially sold vehicles in Australia in 1969, but 40 years later it came extremely close to returning to the local market with the secondgeneration CTS – obtaining local certification and shipping examples from the US – before the global financial crisis scuppered these plans. "Across Australia and New Zealand, we will remain focused on putting the customers first by bringing winning products and a world-class ownership experience," said Ms Bala. "GM Australia and New Zealand has a strong foundation for future growth, deploying new technologies, and building new partnerships to surprise and delight our customers." That "new technologies" line could be another hint towards electric vehicles, though GMSV is also getting ready to launch the hybrid Chevrolet Corvette E-Ray in Australia.



EV models from Cadillac may well appear down under and whether they will be affordable, will be another question? I have read good pieces on the Lyric - Ed.

From the Editors Drivers seat!




A Special Invitation for those attending the 50th and/or Travelling to the USA in the future.

I have mentioned before about Kiwis driving winning cars in the LeMans, Nascar, Indy and now Kiwi Rally driver, Hayden Paddon has become the first non-European Rally Driver to win the European Rally Championship in his Hyundai. Also this last week, 21-year old Kiwi F2 driver, Liam Lawson scored a chance to drive the F1 Ricciardo car in the Dutch F1 GP due to Ricciardo breaking his hand. Liam came a credible 13th for the Alpha-Tauri Team (and ahead of Team Mate, Yuki Tsunoda) in dreadful rain conditions. Liam even passed Charles Leclerc in the Ferrari! The Lyriq is not alone —it has a Japanese relative. Meet

the Acura ZDX.
Cadillac has been working with
Honda through a 'strategic alliance' since 2020 and the fruits of their labour appears in the form of the



ZDX from Honda's luxury brand Acura. It will use GM's BEV3 platform and Ultium Battery and Drive Technology. The ZDX is likely to be built alongside the Cadillac Lyriq at the Spring Hill plant in Tennessee, with production starting later this year. So in answer to the question 'When is a Cadillac not a Cadillac — When it's a posh Honda.'

2024 CT4-V Blackwing - gets 3 Special Editions. Yes if you



thought the CT4-V Blackwing (above) was 'special enough' then you were clearly wrong! With somewhat strange names, the *Impact Edition* comes with a Black Raven exterior colour, the *Arrival Edition* with Mercury Silver Metallic exterior colour and the *Elevation Edition* with Velocity Red exterior colour. The thing that would put me off apart from the price hike would be the inevitable question, "Why is it called Impact/ Arrival/Elevation?" You just know people would ask.

Some call it 'bed-fellows' in car circles (when one brand merely puts their badge on another manufacturers car model). 




