

Steve approached the owner of this heavily customised black '59 about joining our club. Red Firebird convertible was a very nice example.







It's been a month of good outings here in the BoP. Steve and I trotted out the Lincoln to the annual 'All Ford Day' in Tauranga in early March. A lovely summer's day with, we believe a record number of Ford-related attendees, window stickers numbered to #420 from what the writer saw. Ford, being part of the Cadillac 'Family Tree' with two branches: 1) The Bankers 'rolled' Henry Ford in the early 1900s and installed Henry Leland who commenced making a new car called Cadillac at the old Ford plant. 2) Post Cadillac being swallowed by General Motors and falling out with GM Founder, Billy Durant (many fell-out with Billy) Henry Leland formed Lincoln, a luxury alternative to his Cadillac. So good was his second master piece, Henry Ford's son (with the approval of his old man) acquired Lincoln as a luxury car to serve duty in the ranks of the fine Ford family of cars. So there it is, we have two 'branches' in the family tree related to Ford! In the USA especially, there are many joint outings with the Lincoln and Cadillac clubs! Ed













The 'Blue Oval' shone loud and true across Wharepai Domain in Tauranga on a balmy March day. Nearly every Ford was represented. I personally would have loved to have seen an Edsel! A number of vintage Fords were there including a Model A pick up truck, ex-South Island. The now (North Island) owner told me he had purchased it from an 80-something year old owner. Former Caddy member, Ted Williams attended with his 1925 Ford Racer replica. If you ever get to see it, have a close look. It is very authentic looking and hand built by Ted. A real credit to a craftsman thats for sure. Left pic is a very good example of a Model T. One forgets just how big these early cars were. Here it is parked alongside a Falcon. Above is an amazing resto of a Mercury convertible. It truly was an outstanding example. The Ford Retractible was indeed a beautriful example too, gleaming in the sun in its two-tone blue paint scheme. And because the 'All Ford Day' is organised by the proactive Ford Muscle Car Club, there were lots of 'Ford Muscle cars' and Mustangs and a good spread of coloured ones at that! Cadillac Racing returns to the 2023 24 Hours of Le Mans this June with three Hypercars

This year, Cadillac announced that the racing legacy will continue with a return to the 24 Hours of Le Mans in June. The brand's three new hypercars, each identified as the Cadillac V-Series.R, will surely stir up the competition.

Now, the newly named Cadillac V-Series.R hypercars feature a Cadillac 5.5L DOHC V-8 engine developed by GM's Performance and Racing Propulsion team based in Pontiac, Michigan. The race car design incorporates distinctive Cadillac design elements, such as vertical lighting and floating blades.

Cadillac's three V-Series.R race cars were put to the test in late-January during the 61st Rolex 24 at Daytona. The No. 01 Cadillac V-Series.R earned a podium finish, while No. 02 and No. 03 kept up with the chase and landed in fourth and fifth place. They will compete for the overall win in the Hypercar class with revised numbers for the 24 Hours of Le Mans














The best of the best finz images






