New Jersey Inspection Law Update

Dick Bankart recently passed along news that he received a mailing from the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission, updating the policy regarding vehicles that are exempt from mandatory NJ inspection. This information will likely be of interest our members, many of whom own and operate vehicles that qualify for exemption. The cut-out below is not a legal document, but an informational one; members may wish to print out and keep a copy in their vehicles to reference in the event of a traffic stop.

The vehicles listed on this card are no longer required to display inspection stickers after May 1, 2016 pursuant to N.J.A.C 13:20-7.2

- ⇒ Gasoline powered vehicles registered passenger model year 1995 & older with a GVWR 8,500 pounds or less
- ⇒ Gasoline powered vehicles registered passenger model year 2007 & older with a GVWR 8,501 pounds to 14,000 pounds
- ⇒ Gasoline powered vehicles registered passenger model year 2013 & older with a GVWR 14,001 or more

Vehicles owners are still required to maintain all safety and emissions equipment and may at any time be cited for malfunctioning or missing required equipment.

From the Palisades Interstate Parkway (Northbound) The well-marked exit for State Line Lookout is about 2 miles north of Exit 2. Can also be accessed from NJ Route 4 and many other roads.

From the Palisades Interstate Parkway (southbound) Stay in the left lane after passing Exit 3. Take the median U-turn (well marked). Use Caution, as you will need to get into the right lane immediately to exit for State Line Lookout. (The Palisades Interstate Parkway can be accessed from the NY Thruway and many other roads.)

OUR FIRST DECADE

PART THREE



On the tenth anniversary of the club in 2001, club founder/Past President Bob Walton and then-Club President Gerald Meisel wrote a history of the CCNJ as a newsletter supplement. In this special 25th anniversary column, we will reprint their recollections, one year at a time.

1993

Written in 2001 by Bob Walton

In January of 1993 the club held its first “After the Holidays Crunch Brunch” at the Mountainside Inn in Clifton. As a result of the efforts of Sal Santoro, the club banner was unveiled at the brunch. This beautiful banner has enriched the club’s activities ever since. Also at the brunch, the name “Caddy Chatter,” suggested by member Bob Goetzl (‘68 CP) was selected by vote of those present.

In February, we received the news that the management at the Fireplace was concerned that we had grown so large that they withdrew their invitation for us to use their parking lot for our Wednesday evening outdoor meetings. A mad scramble ensued which eventually lead us to the Burger King on Route 17 South in Rutherford which served as our base for the 1993 outdoor season.

Membership cards were issued for the first time in 1993. At the March indoor meeting I was presented with a plaque by the membership, thanking me for my efforts on behalf of the club. I still cherish that plaque.

In April the club logo and decals were designed, printed, and distributed. In July, the club held its first picnic at the Oakland Elks Club Picnic grove in Oakland, NJ. Also in July, member Colette Landi, a producer for the television show Video Fashion Weekly, filmed many members and their cars for a feature entitled, “Made in America.” The professionally produced segment aired on TV all over the country and in over one hundred twenty countries, but we never saw it in the New York area. Members received phone calls from relatives around the country who had seen them on TV. Fortunately, the club received a copy of the beautiful video and we showed it at an indoor meeting accompanied by numerous hoots and hollers as various members made their appearances.

In August, we cruised as a group to Middletown, NY, to assist with a restaurant’s grand opening. What a scene we created; forty old Cadillacs cruising north on the NY Thruway. We were fortunate we didn’t get ticketed for holding a parade without a license. August was also the month in which the first club membership directory was produced and distributed.

In October, our second annual fall show held at Brogan Cadillac of Ridgewood was a major success. Among the twenty new members signed up was Dick Bankart, later to be the club’s third president. Also in October, the Hemmings Vintage Auto Almanac included an entry about our club for the first time.

On the evening after Thanksgiving, six hardy members provided transportation for the Hasbrouck Heights Woman’s Club in their town’s annual Christmas parade. We proudly drove TOPS DOWN the entire route, passing the local bank’s temperature sign proclaiming thirty-two degrees.

What to drive: It is always nice to see collector cars, but it is not necessary for this event.

Directions from the north: Take your favorite Road to I-287 South, Exit 1B. Immediate right off exit ramp (careful, Main Street traffic has right of way) to U.S. 1 South. Wick Shopping Plaza (anyone remember Edison Lanes?) is exactly 2.5 miles ahead on your right. On today's journey the absence of the huge American Flag was conspicuous. It may re-appear in March when the weather improves. If you take the Plainfield Ave exit (this is Fulton Street), HomeTown Buffet will be on your right.

Directions from the south: Take your favorite highway (in most instances this will be NJ 18) to U.S. 1 North. Go over the Morris Goodkind bridge. 0.9 miles past the bridge are the exits for Plainfield Avenue, Follow the signs for Piscataway/Dunellen. Follow the cup handle behind Wallgreens and then back across US 1. Immediately after crossing US 1 turn right on Fulton Street, then left into HomeTown Buffet's parking lot.
