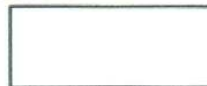

OUR FIRST DECADE

PART FIVE



On the tenth anniversary of the club in 2001, club founder/Past President Bob Walton and then-Club President Gerald Meisel wrote a history of the CCNJ as a newsletter supplement. In this special 25th anniversary column, we will reprint their recollections, one year at a time.

1995

Written in 2001 by Bob Walton

The 1995 Brunch was chaired by Bill Marcy and was held at Waterloo Sue's for the first time. At the brunch, Paul DeGhetto received the very first "Member of the Year" award. We have continued this award ever since then. In February, at Gerry Meisel's suggestion, we took a field trip to Garden State Auto Body in Bergenfield where we learned what the restorer looks for when writing an estimate to restore your car. February was the month in which Rich and Joanne Hassler joined the club. Later, they would serve as the club's merchandise managers for several years. The March indoor meeting featured speaker Ken Maletsky of Autoprops, a company which rents cars for movies, TV, videos, and print ads.

April was a busy month for the club. We had a field trip to Nostalgia Motors in Boonton where we were treated to a tour of their excellent facility. Later in the month, we held our spring show at Claremont Cadillac in West Caldwell. At the Memorial Day parade in Bergenfield the club proudly displayed the large, full color, magnetic club logos for the first time. After much price shopping, I finally came up with the idea to color Xerox enlarge the club decal, laminate them, and attach inexpensive magnets purchased at Rag Shop. Total cost—\$3 per logo as opposed to several estimates of almost a thousand dollars for fifty to be printed in two colors.

On the 4th of July, fourteen members of the club participated in a pre-race parade at the Medowlands Race Track while the official track announcer read a script I had prepared, telling about the club and each individual car. A feature of the parade was the public debut of Sal Santoro's Ghostbuster, completed about fifteen minutes before the parade began. Also, Vic and Beverly Tkaczenko appeared accompanied by Vic's cousins who were visiting from Russia. Picture this scene. Two citizens of a country which not so long ago had been considered our enemy, riding in a classic Cadillac and proudly waving American flags as they passed the main grandstand to the applause of the crowd. God Bless America! Also in July, the club offered wrist watches with the club logo on them for the first time. At the Cadillac LaSalle Club Grand National held in Albany, NY, CCNJ members took home nine trophies including three first place awards in national competition. On a Sunday night that July, the club cruised to another club's cruise night in Bergenfield and had an enjoyable time. We won't talk about the poor guy whose car wouldn't start no matter what we tried.

The fall show was held at Tice's Farm again. In October a fall foliage tour was held to the Red Ribbon Car Show in Goshen, NY. Believe it or not, we actually signed up several new members all the way up there. In November, the club participated in Clifton's Veteran's Day observance, the fiftieth anniversary of the end of WWII. Twenty-five of our members displayed their patriotism and civic pride by honoring our WWII vets. What a great sight those twenty-five Cadillacs were.

1995 (Cont.)



Toward the end of 1995, I announced I would not be running for reelection as president. It was a difficult decision made much easier by the knowledge that the club would be in Sal Santoro's very capable hands.

I will leave the telling of the events of the later years of the club to be told at another time and place, possibly by those who were at the helm of the club as it moved onward and upward to even greater achievements. I know I have not mentioned everyone who played a vital role in the club's development. There were just too many to mention. You know who you are, and I thank you.

So, what have I learned during the first ten years of the Cadillac Club of North Jersey?

- 1) No one is more loyal to a car brand than Cadillac owners.
- 2) Although the cars bring us together, it is the people who make this club great.
- 3) I have made many life-long friends through this club.
- 4) Starting this club developed new skills and talents I never knew I possessed. I learned how to write press releases, publish a newsletter, and many other things I never thought I could or would do.
- 5) I learned that giving up control to others can be a wonderful thing.
- 6) Sal Santoro taught me that people sometimes hesitate to volunteer, but when you ask them personally, they almost always say, "Yes," and do a great job.
- 7) Dick Bankart taught me how to respond to complaints and suggestions. The correct response is, "Great idea. I'll mark you down as chair of that committee."
- 8) There is a line from an old Hebrew folk song that goes, "In every age a hero or sage came to our aid." This club has been like that. Every time there has been a need, someone was there to fill it. Besides the elected officers, the club has been blessed with many individuals who are not interested in running for office, but when something needs to be done, they are always willing to put their other activities aside and work for the good of the club. With people like that, it's no wonder this club is so great.
- 9) I'd like to repeat two quotes from our first vice president, Floyd Cole. The first is, "Never fall in love with an inanimate object." Good advice. As much as we like our cars, real love should be reserved for people. And the second quote is, "When you are driving a thirty-year-old car, every time you turn the key, it's an adventure."

For me, the last ten years have been a fabulous adventure. I want to thank everyone who has done so much to help make this club one of the premier automobile clubs in New Jersey. And I want to offer encouragement and help to those who have been selected to keep it running. Ten years ago, I went looking for a Cadillac club to join. I thank God that I didn't find one, because I'm sure it would never have been as great as this one. God willing, ten years from now, we will all get together and celebrate the **twentieth** anniversary of this club which has so enriched our lives. Thank you.

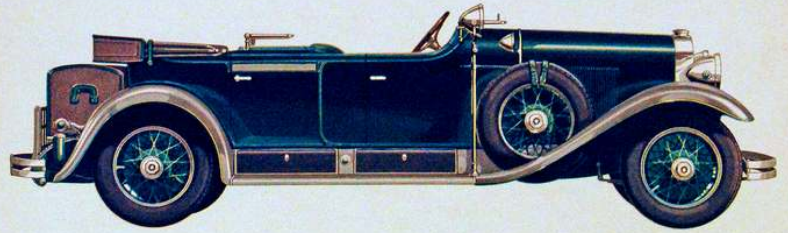
