Late spring, early summer is a fine time to enjoy the east coast of Florida and attend the Cadillac & LaSalle Grand National convention, hosted by the Florida Suncoast Region, and taking place at the fabulous Marriott Renaissance Resort at World Golf Village. Even with the usual June rains, it was an exciting event, enjoyed by the 605 attendees and the 166 Cadillac and LaSalle cars that were registered for show and judging. NTXCLC members were treated to tours of the 172-car private collection of Robert Shearer in Mims, Florida, and in the St. Augustine area the Castillo de San Marcos Fort, the Lightner Museum, the Alligator Farm Zoological Park, St. Augustine Lighthouse & Museum, Daytona International Speedway, the Fountain of Youth, and dinner at the famous Columbia Restaurant. The hotel and surrounding grounds is set in the motif of golf, since the Golf Hall Of Fame is located here, and the two golf courses have a four-and-a-half stars rating (out of five). And it is near the east Florida beaches for those so inclined to swim and tan in the Atlantic surf. Great cars, great location.

We also stopped early morning to see the capitol of Florida at Tallahassee, which was very picturesque and full of history.

Tuesday we began by boarding a tour bus to town of **MIMS** to visit Bob Sherear's private automobile collection housed in 6 secured air conditioned buildings, containing 172 cars of all different makes. His collection consists mostly of 1950s & 1960s Cadillacs of which he is most fond of.

Other locations we toured were the Castillo de San Marcos Fort made from rare locally quarried stone consisting of seashells and limestone. A very unique feature was that this soft stone absorbed cannon shot and was easily repairable.



The Lightner Museum--- a large collection of more than 40,000 items, many of which were salvaged from the great Chicago fire and eventually relocated to St. Augustine and housed in a large closed building during the Depression.

Flager College, a flourishing college now, was originally the huge plush hotel Alcazar built in 1887.



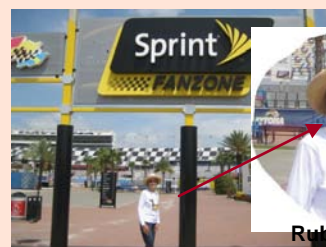
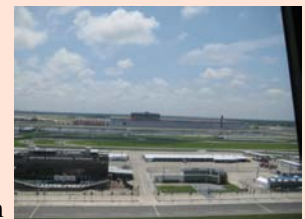

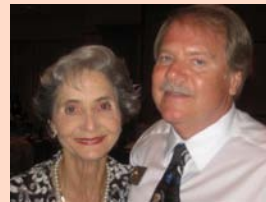

Under the Editor's Bonnet by Lifer



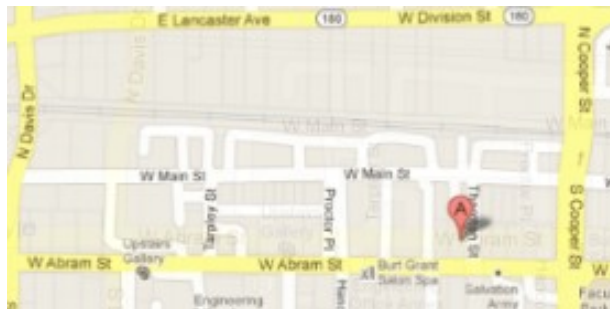
