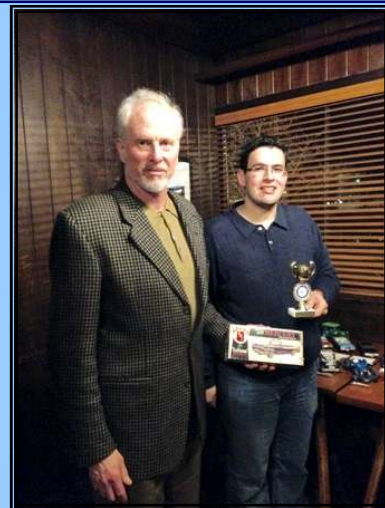
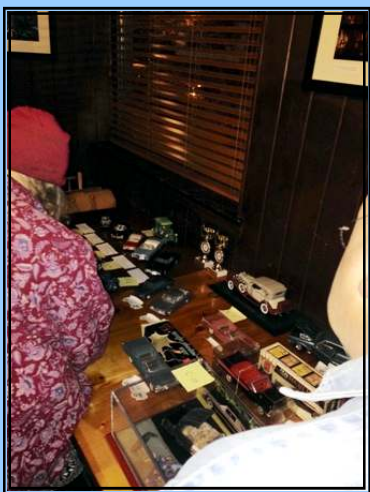
Directions to our Spring Show

OUR FIRST DECADE

PART TWO



On the tenth anniversary of the club in 2001, club founder/Past President Bob Walton and then-Club President Gerald Meisel wrote a history of the CCNJ as a newsletter supplement. In this special 25th anniversary column, we will reprint their recollections, one year at a time.

1992

Written in 2001 by Bob Walton

The year 1992 was a landmark year for the club. By the time the club had its first official indoor meeting in January of 1992, there were thirty-two names on the mailing list. At that momentous meeting attended by half (sixteen) of the membership, many decisions were made which are still in effect today. Some of those decisions were to limit the club to Cadillacs at least fifteen years old, to seek a location for our own Cadillac-only cruise-ins, to do parades together as a club, and to try to have an all-Cadillac show. Also, the official club license plate was approved using the old NJ colors of buff background with black letters.

The club's first television exposure was on Channel 7 Eye Witness News on September 21. It was a terrible piece, did not get our name or location right, and generated no new members. And the reporter kept intentionally putting finger marks on Viktor Tkaczenko's mirror finish Park Avenue sedan.

Our first all-Cadillac show was held on Saturday, September 26, 1992, at Brogan Cadillac of Ridgewood. Fifty-five gleaming Cadillacs drew hundreds of spectators and many new members. Four trophies were awarded: First Place, Second Place, Third Place, and Best of Show. The good folks at Brogan must have been pleased, because shortly thereafter, they generously reimbursed us for the \$500 in legal fees associated with incorporating the club.

During the summer and fall some of our members had the experience of having their cars used in a feature film, "A Bronx Tale," starring Robert De Niro. Dom Tucci had his '60 Eldo Biarritz CV and his '66 DV CV very prominently featured and I had my '68 CV in one scene. Other club members also participated, but I can't recall who they all were. Poor Paul DeGhetto. He was told by the agent that his car would be one of the featured cars. For months he patiently waited for the phone to ring, but it never did. The agent had decided that he wanted to keep the rental money for himself, so he bought a red '68 DV CV and never had the decency to call Paul and tell him what he did. Such is life.

In October, the club got its own telephone number and answering machine. This set us apart from many other clubs which were, and still are, difficult for prospective members to find. We were in the phone book! By this time the membership had ballooned to two hundred twenty-five members! Also in October, the club held its first road trip, a fall foliage tour, thirty miles through scenic northern Bergen County.

In November, the club's first business cards were printed and distributed to members. This permitted members to recruit new members simply by leaving a card on the windshield wiper of any old Cadillac they saw. Some members were amused when they found cards left on their cars by other members who didn't know they were already in the club.

By this time, the newsletter regularly was four pages. It was a two-column affair with no photos. The classifieds section had six cars for sale and two want ads. Bill Marcy was handling the phone calls for the classifieds section. And so ended 1992.

Dear CCNJ members,

Letter from Bob Walton

It is with great regret that I am unable to be with you today to begin the 25th anniversary year of the Cadillac Club of North Jersey, the North Jersey Region of the Cadillac and La Salle Club. I fully expected to present these words in person however I needed to leave for Florida earlier than originally planned. My brother, Ken, needs someone to assist him with his recovery after his emergency triple by-pass surgery. He is doing very well but still requires some assistance.

It is absolutely astounding to me that it has been almost a quarter century since the founding of this amazing club. As many of the long-time members know, shortly after I acquired my blue 1968 De Ville convertible in March of 1991, I was bemoaning the absence of a local Cadillac club when someone said, “Well, if there isn’t a club why don’t you start one?” So I did. I was 43 years old then. I’ll save you the trouble of doing the math; next month I’ll be 68.

Little did that person making the suggestion to start a Cadillac club know what they had set into motion. Leaping outside my comfort zone I had to develop a whole new skill set learning how to create flyers, press releases, publicity, logos, newsletters and much, much more, and within a year we had more than 100 dues-paying members. As a result of a full color article about the club in the Bergen Record, in one month of 1992 we signed up a phenomenal 72 new members! Shortly thereafter the club was approached by Peter Brogan requesting we present an all Cadillac show at Brogan Cadillac of Ridgewood. That began a wonderful relationship which lasted until they closed the dealership.

How exciting it was to come home from work each day and find one, two or even three new membership applications in the mail box! All of this was not accomplished single-handed; far from it. Early on the excitement was contagious and several individuals stepped forward to participate in the running of the club. The late Floyd Cole, the late Jim McCann, Sal Santoro and I were the first club officers and did much to set precedents, many of which are still in place today. Dominic Tucci secured the Fireplace as our home base. From day one my old friend from Clifton High School, Paul DeGhetto, volunteered to do whatever needed to be done and he continues to do so.

It is not always easy stepping down from the presidency of an organization but it was easy for me because I knew the club would be in the very capable hands of Sal Santoro. A list of other past presidents includes Dick Bankart (who served as President two different times), the late Gerry Meisel, Jay Weitzman, Bill Marcy, Rich Sroka and of course, Lois Harriman, who, by the way, has served as president longer than any previous president. I personally want to thank each and every one who served as president, especially since very often they were the only ones willing to accept such a

daunting task. Each person who served as president kept the club alive adding their own unique touch and to them all I say, “Thank you, thank you, thank you!”

Many other members have contributed to the success of the club both in elected and non-elective positions. Few clubs have a monthly newsletter of such a high quality. I wish especially to thank those who have helped create, edit, duplicate, distribute and improve our “Caddy Chatter,” the glue which holds this club together. While many have labored to produce the newsletter, Viktor and Beverly Tkaczenko are especially to be commended for not only editing the newsletter but also distributing it for many years. More recently, Tony Albarella has taken it to a whole new national award-winning level.

I apologize in advance to those who have made significant contributions to the club but whom my feeble, sexagenarian brain has overlooked. It is not possible to individually thank each and every member who served in some capacity or another. You and the presidents with whom you served know who you are and we thank you. You have my eternal gratitude. However, I would be remiss if I didn’t give a special shout out to Dick Bankart who, in addition to every other role he has performed for the CCNJ, has been our membership chairperson for more than twenty years, fastidiously keeping an accurate record of every human being who has ever been a member. I also want to thank Mike Cascio, whose dedication and perseverance propelled our club to national status with the CLC despite many challenges.

In recent years the club has been fortunate to have new members step forward and volunteer to serve on the board of directors and in other volunteer positions. I view this as a strong predictor of the club’s continued success. As I see it, the challenge of the future is to continue to make our club “The Friendly Club” and to make ALL lovers of Cadillacs welcome regardless of the age, model or level of originality of their cars. A special effort to recruit younger members will yield long-term benefits and assure the future of the club.

The club has been such a big part of my life in the past 25 years that I cannot imagine what my life would have been without it. I’ve made life-long friends and had experiences beyond my wildest expectations. The list of experiences which grew out of my owning a collector Cadillac and belonging to this club goes way beyond my personal bucket list and exceeds my ability to even imagine such things. I know that many of you have had some similar experiences which never would have occurred had you not been a member of the greatest car club around, the Cadillac Club of North Jersey!

What a wonderful wild ride it has been! Congratulations on 25 wonderful years and best wishes for at least 25 more. As the King of Rock and Roll would say, “Thank you, thank you very much.”

Dear Bob,

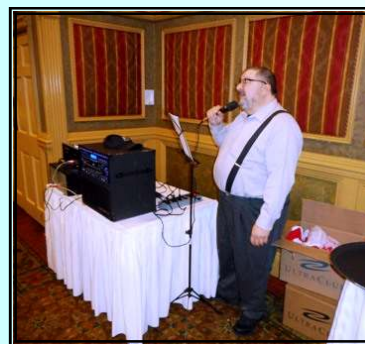
