THE CAR NOBODY WANTED!

As some of you may know, I have taken over the ads for The Toy Shop since Dick Bankart's passing in 2021. My approach is a bit different than Dick's was, because I try to encourage people towards reality, especially when it is about pricing. Some people may feel that this is not part of my job, but I do.

When I took over, one of the first listings that was already there was a non-running 1984 Coupe DeVille for \$4,000, without a picture. So I called the seller and I encouraged him to send me a picture and to consider lowering his price. So, he sent me a picture and lowered the price to \$2,950. A month later, he asked me how much I thought he might be able to sell the car for. I told him that although it looks nice, there are concerns by many regarding the HT4100 engine, and the fact that the car was not running was the kiss of death. I further told him that by looking at the picture, I felt the car would run again, but it would cost maybe a thousand dollars to do that and then it may have problems.

Several weeks later, he offered me the car for free, to which I immediately said yes. When Lucille and I drove to White House Station to collect the papers, we were pleasantly surprised to see a very well-cared for, white coupe, in a nice garage. Wow, even the original medium blue velour interior looked and smelled fresh, right down to the Cadillac floor mats. It turns out that his father bought this car new in South Carolina and came to NJ in 1993 with 83K miles. During the following twenty years, the Cadillac was lovingly maintained, used sparingly and kept in a garage. Just before his father's passing in 2012, there were many repairs performed, with all of the receipts. With 125,671 miles on the odometer, it sat for ten years.

Stan Bielen, the original owner's son, told me that this Caddy was his father's pride and joy. He was thrilled to give the car to Lucille and me, with the hope that it would run again and be enjoyed.

When my skeptical mechanic saw and inspected the car, he was impressed with what he saw. Within two days, he had drained the gas tank and cleaned it and installed a new fuel pump, screen, a new sending unit, new battery, and fluid and filter changes. Now she purrs like a kitten.

The car then made a thirty mile ride without a problem. We will be installing a new set of tires and doing a few minor cosmetic touchups and a nice detailing come the spring. I can't say that I woke up one day, dreaming of owning a 1984 Coupe, but I will say that the style has aged well and it looks beautiful to us.

Who knows what the future will hold for the Caddy, but it is off to a very good start. I have thanked Stan Bielen profusely for the gift of his dad's beloved Coupe De Ville. We have promised him that if we still hav the car, we'll drive back to his home and take him for a ride in the warmer weather, perhaps even take him out for lunch.

EDITOR'S NOTE: Bill submitted this article to me over the winter. He subsequently sold this '84 Cadillac to a new owner back in April. The "car nobody wanted" is not only back on the road (thanks to Bill), but now back in the hands of somebody who indeed wanted it.




