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The right place, right time, right product! By Roger Zimmermann



In the early eighties I met two brothers in the city of Bienne, the watch industry town, with factories for Rolex, Omega and so forth. The two brothers were driving old US iron: a 1958 Cadillac Serie 62 for Joël and a 1958 Chevrolet Bel-Air sedan for Jean-Luc. Those kinds of cars were a dream for me since I was a boy, but I had not the courage to get into the hobby.

Mostly because the influence from the two brothers, I bought a 1956 Cadillac Sedan de Ville in March 1982, but this is another story.

If I recall correctly, Joël saw a 1959 Cadillac near Bienne; this car had a defective engine, and the rear fins were gone. As the quest for spare parts was great at that time, Joël intended to buy the car but had not the money. Enter another person in the picture: Frederic Hirt. He had the money, and he had the space to store the car, plus he had a 1959 4-windows Sedan de Ville.

According to a note, the pictures were done in October 1994; therefore, Frederic was already the first president of the Swiss Cadillac Club, which was founded at about the same time.



That '59 60S was indeed not in a bad shape; an engine can be repaired or another one installed, but a '59 Cadillac without the fins has just no appeal. Joël and Frederic decided to part out the vehicle. Joël needed a transmission for his '58 and Frederic took the harmonic balancer for his car. They began to remove parts and one day I was "invited" to help.





The 60S was quickly deconstructed and every part which was assembled with a screw was removed. At the end, only the body shell remained. As we had no use for it, it was finally crushed which was a pity because the floor was in an excellent shape and could have be used to restore a convertible, for example. However, as the place was tight, exit the body.

When we were finished, Frederic gave me a key for the barn where the parts were stored telling me that in case, I could sell something it was more efficient to have the key and not let Joël or him to come. I thought: "me, selling parts? He is dreaming!"

In fact, I sold about everything. There are good reasons for that: first, some people new that used parts for a '59 were available and, second, when people needed parts for a GM car, they called GM in Bienne. The phone operator knew me and instead to redirect the calls to the spare parts department, she directed the calls to me! Of course, she did that only for older vehicles.

In a rather short time, the rear axle, the frame, most of the bright work were sold. I remember that the inside trim was sold, but don't remember if I was



"responsible" for that sale. As my job at GM required to travel almost everywhere in Switzerland, I could also deliver small parts or moldings!

The money I got with the parts was spited in 3 parts so Frederic and Joël got their share. A word about those two people: Joël has now a small garage near Bienne. Frederic resigned as president from the club and moved. Nobody knows what happened to him and why he left rather suddenly. As I was vice-president for the club, I inherited the president function I kept for some years.

I still have some parts from that car like the A/C condenser; a molding or two and small parts nobody will ever need (maybe). Would such an adventure be so profitable right now? I don't think so as people are searching what they need over Internet. We were at the right place at the right time with the right product!

My first was a beautiful black 1960 series 62 convertible which I later repainted to its original heather.


