Alex B. two years ago encouraged LSC to have a show with our sister clubs and it was a success in 2023. This 2nd annual BOPC show had outstanding cars and owners! Your club should consider a car show like this for your local area. Connie would be happy to share all computer files, ballots, registration books, etc. with you for easy setup. Our BOPC "Best of" show and ladies choice was our Lone Star member Paul Vinyard. for his captivating 1959 Cadillac Coupe DeVille! A moment to appreciate timeless wheels that live in our memory.



I am so grateful to have lived in such an era of cars and music. 1955-56-57-58-59-60 cars appeared to be all new. The zenith for me was 1959. No computer aids. A slide rule, stylists and engineers who loved cars reflected Detroit's finest. Serious competitors. Pontiac's GM Pete Estes said, "Two things sell—styling and performance". The 1959 Bonneville, first wide-track had a 73% increase in sales and the first of four Motor Trends "Car of the Year." Cadillac was first M/T 1949! The world's most enduring motor vehicle is the 1959 Cadillac. Design is proportion. A look of "sheer presence." The 1959 Ca-dillac convertible and Eldorado convertible dominate shape so beautifully executed and are distinctive icons. Stylist achieved a highlighted image from head lamps to rear bumpers gracefully to "suggest movement." Also very expensive, the 1959 models cost GM 687 million dollars and yes, GM made money!

The gorgeous cars of that era suffered one weakness - rust! In 1959, we had no knowledge of future rust inhibitors such as zinc chromate, plastisol's, galvanic corrosion between adjoining parts, minimal body tuck under and plastic fender wells that surrounded the tire without bolting to the top fenders trapping corrosive road salts. Much of this extended the life of vehicles for years. One last inhibitor—lack of beauty treatments and neglect. Caution: unheated garage floors harbor moisture dissolving interior floor pans and under carriages into

oblivion.

So, enjoy these flawless car show vehicles that are a rarity in life. Oh, the Southern and Western cars suffered heat damaged interiors. Also objections stem from unfamiliarity with the cars. True enthusiast drivers respect survival rides. Do you enjoy looking at 1950 new rides? Watch old Perry Mason reruns!
