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In '65 they stacked 'em high!

STACKED HEADLIGHTS on Cadillac's model range was introduced on the 1965 models. But Stacked Headlights were not new. Their beginnings started in the early 1960s with many a Mopar model with 'slanted stacked lights' that lasted a couple of years maturing to a fully vertical form. As can be seen below, nearly every marque sported the Stacked-fashion. In fact, one could debate that maybe Cadillac was the last brand to sport them, albeit they were probably on the Cadillac drawing boards since maybe 1960/61 given the longer lead-in times in those days?

One of your Editor's first favourite American cars was a 1966 Pontiac Grand Prix, red (and the 'real' red) with white interior, lots of chrome, wheel spats and vertical headlights! Maybe some of those features stuck in the sub-concious given my Calais is cream interior, wheel spats, lots of chrome and vertical headlights?! Let's begin the 'Story of Stax!'

STACKED HEADLIGHTS featured on most of the Cadillac model range with the exception of the '65 Limos. A new additional model, the Calais was introduced for 1965 and would remain into the 1970s. The Calais was created as a more affordable entry model that would enable new Buyers to 'Step Up to Cadillac' and that included GM's Buick and Pontiac brands which were in themselves highly spec'ed but 'never a Cadillac'. Cadillac was the revered marque amongst all brands. That's not to say your fantastic Chev or fabulous Ford LTD are not nice, it's only 'It will never be a Cadillac!' But of course Cadillac came at a price which mean't a new Caddy was out of reach for most car buyers, hence the Calais was the model to bridge that gap. Calais models were virtually indistinguishable from a DeVille, but generally had less chrome jewellery and less 'standard features' which of course could be 'ticked' as options! Enjoy the pictures. Photos are of several different series: The Red boxes are the 24 K gold plated ornaments that were given out between 1985 and 2014 by the Cadillac General managers these are very special we have eleven of them. The second series are the GM Heritage center ornaments that were produced around 2017. The Cadillacs in the series include 1903 Cad, 1927 LaSalle, 1957 Eldo Brougham, and 1959 Conv. and then three, 3-D 1959 Cad conv in blue, 1959 Cad CDV in red and a 1955 Cad SDV in Pink, the third series are miscellaneous ornaments produced by Hallmark, and various others mostly "Pink Cadillacs" , the fourth series are known as the Department 56 series that were made for Snow village displays, the three Cadillac are the 1956 SDV, 1957 Eldo Brougham, and a yellow 1959 Eldorado Seville. GM launches Cadillac F1 team and engine

General Motors and TWG Global have agreed in principle with Formula 1 to bring a Cadillac team to the series in 2026. GM is also launching an F1 power unit that will allow the Cadillac Formula 1 Team to become a "full works" team, building its cars and engines by the end of the decade. Cadillac would be the first new team to join F1 since 2016 and the eleventh team on the grid. General Motors and TWG Global have reached an agreement in principle with Formula 1 to bring a Cadillac team to the series in 2026. This GM Design rendering of the Cadillac Formula 1 Team's conceptual theme pays tribute to the brand's American heritage. Launching an F1 team will promote the Cadillac brand to a diverse international audience and showcase GM's technology and design capabilities. "As the pinnacle of motorsports, F1 demands boundary-pushing innovation and excellence. It's an honour for General Motors and Cadillac to join the world's premier racing series, and we're committed to competing with passion and integrity to elevate the sport for race fans worldwide," said GM President Mark Reuss. "This is a global stage for us to demonstrate GM's engineering expertise and technology leadership at an entirely new level," Reuss say. "We're excited to partner with General Motors in bringing a dynamic presence to Formula 1," said Dan Towriss, CEO of TWG Global's motorsports businesses. "Together, we're assembling a team embodying American innovation and delivering unforgettable moments to race fans worldwide. We appreciate FIA and FOM's support of our application and recognition of the value we can bring to the championship," he says. Mario Andretti, the last American F1 Champion, will be the team's board director. "My first love was Formula 1, and 70 years later, the F1 paddock is still my happy place. I'm thrilled with Cadillac, Formula 1, Mark Walter, and Dan Towriss," Andretti says, "To still be involved at this stage of my life — I have to pinch myself to ensure I'm not dreaming." Since GM's bid to join F1 was announced in January 2023, Cadillac Formula 1 has assembled an experienced team to work on aerodynamics, chassis and component development, software, and vehicle dynamics simulation. The team operates in Fishers, Indiana; Charlotte, North Carolina; Warren, Michigan; and Silverstone, England. GM has decades of racing success and a rich history of developing high-performance powertrains. It has won over 3,000 races and over 100 motorsports championships, both driver and manufacturer categories. In addition to the Cadillac F1 partnership with GM, TWG Global owns and operates Andretti Global, Wayne Taylor Racing, and Spire Motorsports. And just like that, another Media Release! Cadillac's first years of Formula 1 will be driven by Ferrari power, it has been announced. The GM brand has been pushing to enter F1 with Andretti Racing and, after initially being rebuffed, has been granted a slot on the grid for the 2026 season. Cadillac already has F1 facilities in the U.S. and the U.K. but the company is not expected to be able to supply its own power unit until 2028, so has had to find a suitable partner. Ferrari was always Mario Andretti's preference, having raced withe the Scuderia in 1971 and 1972 (and briefly in 1982) and now the Italian manufacturer has confirmed that a deal has been done. Ferrari already supplies U.S. team Haas and Swiss setup Sauber, which will switch to Audi power in 2026. New rules for 2026 will require the power units to run on 100 percent sustainable fuels with an equal split between internal combustion and electric power and Ferrari is already well-ahead on the engineering process. "It's great to see the commitment of another American team, backed by one of the most highly respected margues in the motor industry, at a time when Formula 1 is increasing in popularity in the United States," said Ferrari team principal Fred Vasseur. "We are delighted therefore that we will be supplying the team with our power unit and gearbox as the basis of this technical collaboration. It means we will continue to have two customer teams in the championship with all the benefits this brings in terms of technical development within Ferrari." Cadillac team principal Graeme Lowdon added, "We are thrilled to partner with Ferrari as the power unit and gearbox supplier for our Cadillac team, bringing together two remarkable legacies. Choosing the right power unit partner is crucial, and we trust in Ferrari's passion, excellence and the exceptional capabilities of their people." Ferrari missed out on the 2024 Formula 1 Constructors' title by just 14 points from McLaren and, while Haas and Sauber finished seventh and tenth in the standings, there were points in the season when Ferrari's customer cars proved to be just as quick as the factory team. Cadillac's F1 debut won't be lacking (prancing) horsepower, that's for sure. End.

With some resemblance to the Tesla Cybertruck, this 1950 Cadillac-powered Le Mans competitor called the Series 61 "Le Monstre", was a Briggs Cunningham creation. Running an 8-cylinder 90° V and overhead valves, with a 5 carburetor induction system, the 331 cu. inch engine produced 160 hp at 3800 rpm. "Le Monstre's scale body was tested in a wind tunnel and mounted on a tubular 'crash frame. It had a 130 mph top speed and completed the 24 Hours of Le Mans in 11th place.

Allard Motor Works witnessed this 'head-turner' replica at the Watkins Glen Raceway in September.

AMW can testify that it has a higher "WOW" factor than today's Cybertruck.




