

Slick '66!





I the attach picture of my 1976 Eldorado Bicentennial (one of only 200 built to commemorate the USA Bicentennial, and they were the last big Convertibles built by GM and Ford due to safety requirements that made their life over) I am of course devastated to loose my car in this way while I am not certain but the issue was caused due to a fuel leak. I pulled over to see why the car was" stuttering" and "Wooosh" up it went. Under my insurance I will get the car back under the "Salvage" rules of my policy. And yes it was well insured. I think my Cadillac days are over and the car will be offered for sale as a potential rebuild (for which will be difficult and very expensive with the Aust and the USS \$) for parts. Or it will become a parts car. We will see how things progress. Ron, are their many 73-76 Eldorado's in New Zealand as I will have parts from the car when I get it back plus I have a number of parts from the Eldorado. 
Cadillac F1 'Giga Factory' in USA - Formula 1: Cadillac plans massive North Carolina factory for 2026 F1 entry – Cadillac's entry into Formula One is set to usher in a new era for American motorsport, with the General



Motors-owned brand making significant progress in preparation for its 2026 debut. As part of its ambitious F1 project, Cadillac plans to build a state-of-the-art factory in North Carolina and position itself as a serious contender on the grid. Some have described it as Cadillac's 'Giga Factory' to highlight the ambition toward the newest works team F1 entry.





Yes, I have seven Cadillac genuine horns and all operate to blast a Cm11th chord. I can instantly adjust the wiring to blow different tones depending on my mood! The tones are:

Eb-Eldorado long trumpet Bb-low G-mid pitch F-high pitch trumpet C-long

Eldorado low C-an adjusted A note to blow A#.

Don't you just love Cadillacs! I am currently repairing my by-pass valve for the air con. Once done, everything will be working as Cadillacs deserve. Best regards to you. Rob Jolly, Auckland

The Optiq is 4.8m long and 1.6m in height so it's not exactly small, and not too far off the Lyriq which is just shy of 5m long. The

Optiq features a dual motor all-wheel drive powertrain with 224kW and 480Nm. It has an 85kWh battery and a 480km range. It's said to deliver 'classdefining cargo capacity and rear row passenger room'. The Vistiq will be a bit of a monster measuring 5222mm long, 2.2 m wide and 1.8m in height. This "ensures the luxury of space for all passengers while maintaining the brand's commitment to a spirited drive". It too has dual motor allwheel drive with up to 458kW and 880Nm

Is there an EV Cadillac in your future? Hey Kiwi Members, the NZ launch is getting closer...

Cadillac has confirmed it will be adding two additional EV models to its lineup in Australia and New Zealand with the Optiq and Vistiq. These are described as 'bookends' to the Cadillac lineup locally where the Optiq will be a new entry-point in terms of size while the Vistiq is a large, three-row SUV sitting at the top. These are produced in righthand drive from the factory in the US and when they arrive in 2026, they will join the Lyriq and Lyriq V in the showroom. It is said that both these models have been planned and engineered to be built right and drive from their inception. It's all part of Cadillac's global push into the luxury segment and these models will also be available in other RHD markets like Japan and Australia. Cadillac says that the Vistiq, which it calls a stunning three-row SUV, will 'unlock luxurious electric motoring for larger families'. The Optiq is suggested as a new entry point sitting beneath the Lyriq although Cadillac is stressing that point in terms of its size. According to Jess Bala, managing director of General Motors Australia and New Zealand: "these exciting new models will double Cadillac's lineup appealing to an even broader range of customers and usage requirements and allowing


