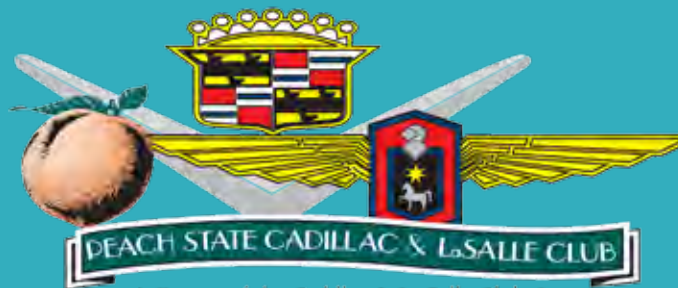

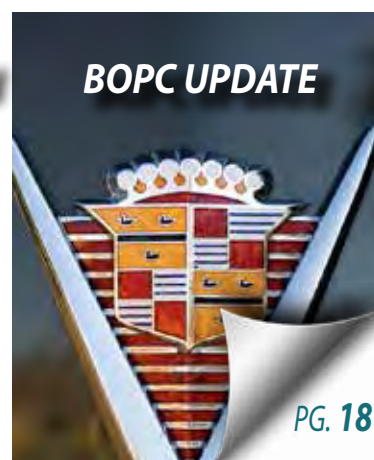

AVONDALE ESTATES EASTER PARADE

Sunday, April 20, 2014 at 1:30 PM

The annual Easter old car parade will be held in a lovely corner of DeKalb County called Avondale Estates. There will be a rally beginning an hour before the event kicks off at 2:30 PM.

A posse of men and women in blue will block off the streets so we can sail through red lights and stop signs. Past parades have included 40 or 50 cars wending their way through the picturesque streets of Avondale. The people of Avondale are famous for turning out in good weather to sit on the lawns and on the curbs in front of their houses. They are known to applaud as the old cars pass by. Drivers will honk horns and throw Easter candies to the crowd. After an hour or so of slow cruising, we will end up in a city park where refreshments will be served.

We will assemble at the Twin Oaks Shopping Plaza, 2853 East College Avenue, Avondale Estates, GA 30032 at about 1:30 PM. The parade will start at 2:30 PM. The Avondale Estates Police Department will lead us through the residential areas. It is acceptable to carefully throw wrapped candy to the kids. The parade will end at Willis Park where refreshments will be provided by Peach State Cadillac and LaSalle Club. Local residents are invited to join us at the park for a closer look.

— DIRECTIONS —

From Conyers: Take I-20 West to I-285 North to exit 43, Covington Highway. Turn left on Covington Highway and go over the bridge. Continue on Covington Highway, cross over Memorial Drive and into the Avondale Estates city limits. Like most roads in Atlanta the road name changes, but the road does not. Covington Highway becomes North Avondale Road and runs parallel to South Avondale Road.

From Duluth: Take I-85 South to exit 95A, I-285 Bypass toward Augusta/Macon. Take I-285 South to exit 41, Memorial Drive/Avondale Estates, turn right. Go to the second traffic light and turn right on Mountain Drive. Turn Right on Covington Highway. Like most roads in Atlanta the road name changes, but the road does not. Covington Highway becomes North Avondale Road and runs parallel to South Avondale Road.

From Roswell: Take GA 400 South to I-285 East toward Greenville/Augusta to exit 41, Memorial Drive/Avondale Estates, turn right. Go to the second traffic light and turn right on Mountain Drive. Turn Right on Covington Highway. Like most roads in Atlanta the road name changes, but the road does not. Covington Highway becomes North Avondale Road and runs parallel to South Avondale Road.

PLANNING FOR THE FALL CLC NATIONAL DRIVING TOUR

SEPTEMBER 20 — 30, 2014

A few of us are planning a LONG drive in September. **You are welcome to join us!** The idea is to join the CLC's National Fall Driving Tour – which originates in Kokomo, IN and runs up to Hickory Corners, MI to visit the brand new Cadillac and LaSalle Club Museum. Between Kokomo and Michigan are the Studebaker and Auburn/Cord/Duesenberg Museums and a number of private collections! Now, that is a LONG drive from Atlanta – over 1600 miles round trip, and it will take 11 or 12 days to accomplish. But it's a great opportunity to do some once-in-a-lifetime things along the way, if we plan well.

Below is an early version of our itinerary. It's likely to change more than once before September. Think it over and let us know if you're interested in driving along with us! Currently serious about participating are Doug Bailey, Ron Zahn, Bill Greene, Lee and Mary Jean Dunn, Tom and Linda Di Nucci, and possibly Martina and Frank Butler. (**NOTE:** This is NOT the Peach State Fall Driving Tour! That is scheduled for October, and closer to home.)

We think we will leave for Nashville on Saturday 9/20 or Sunday 9/21. We will rally at the Harley dealership in Cartersville, and do lunch in Monteagle. We will drive to Nashville and spend the night at the Hotel Preston, where we stayed during the 2013 driving tour. It's possible we will go on up one hour north of Nashville and stay in Bowling Green if we can get into the Corvette Museum on Sunday. **Monday 9/22.** We want to tour the bourbon distilleries near Louisville, something called the Bourbon Trail (or "crawl"). (*We may have to do that on the way south, on the way home. More on that as the plan sorts itself out.*) It's possible that the caravan will split up for a day, reuniting in Kokomo. **From Louisville it's a 3-hour drive to Kokomo:** The tour's hosts, the Indiana region of CLC, will be visiting the Elwood Haynes Museum, the Sieberling Mansion, and Kokomo Opalescent Glass on Monday. We'll spend the night in Kokomo.

Tuesday 9/23. The national tour begins at 6:30 PM with a Welcome Party at Kokomo Automotive Museum. Spend the night in Kokomo. **Wednesday, 9/24.** Tour Kokomo: United States Vice Presidents Museum Huntington; Lunch in Huntington; Tour Fairmount Historical Museum James Dean exhibit and James Dean Gallery, Fairmount; Supper at local restaurant; Overnight in Kokomo. **Thursday, 9/25.** Drive from Kokomo to South Bend. Tour John Gambs Collection, Lafayette; Lunch in Monticello on the lake; Tour LaPorte County Museum; Supper at Studebaker Museum; Overnight in South Bend at Doubletree. **Friday, 9/26.** (South Bend to Auburn) Amish Acres Tour and lunch at Nappanee; **Tour the Auburn-Cord-Duesenberg Museum;** Supper and tour at NATM. Overnight in Auburn. **Saturday 9/27.** (Auburn to Hickory Corners) Mid America- Windmill Museum; Hudson Museum, Menno-Hof, quilt gardens lunch in Shipshewana; End at Hickory Corners with Saturday night banquet at Holiday Inn. Overnight in Hickory Corners. **Sunday 9/28.** The Cadillac Fall Festival. Overnight in Hickory Corners.

Monday 9/29. Drive home to Georgia: Drive back to Kokomo. From there we have two alternatives: drive to Bloomington, IN and spend the night, touring Doug's alma mater Indiana University (one of the most beautiful campuses in the US) in the afternoon. That route leads us on Tuesday, 9/30 to drive to the Ohio River, crossing at Owensboro, and back to Bowling Green KY to visit the Corvette Museum. If we did that on the way north, then alternative 2 would route us from Kokomo to Louisville, where we could visit the distilleries on the way home. Either way, it might be Wednesday, 10/1 when we drive the last leg back through Nashville, and on back to Atlanta.

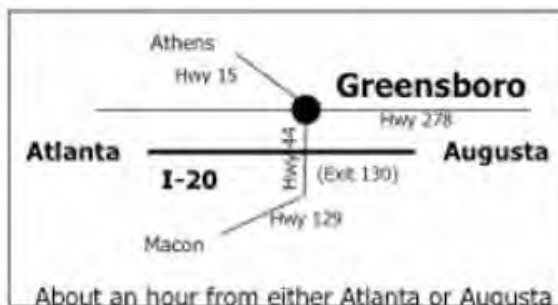

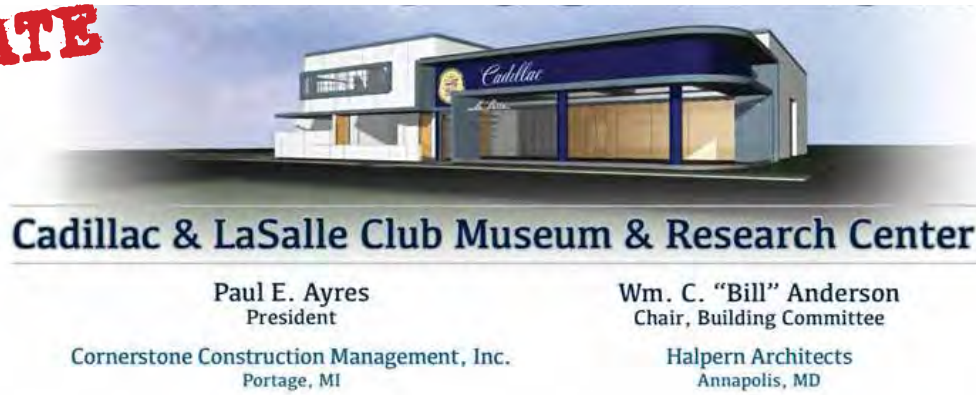

BUILDING PROGRESS REPORT

Building completion estimate - June 30, 2014

Grand Opening Celebration - September 28, 2014

Here's the most current information and photos on the construction of the CLC museum building at the Gilmore Car Museum in Hickory Corners, Michigan (near Kalamazoo). You can monitor the weekly construction progress on these social media sites:

Fortunately, all site preparation and the concrete foundation work was completed in December prior to the onset of the severe 2014 winter weather that is being experienced in the midwest. The pre-fabricated steel that forms the structure of the building arrived shortly before the Christmas holidays.

In spite of the record snowfall (about 70 inches to date) and chilling arctic temperatures (15 degrees below zero), Cornerstone construction has continued to soldier on. This has been the coldest and snowiest winter since the 1970s. But by the end of January the entire main steel structure was in place. The pre fabricated steel is assembled in much the same manner as an erector set. The installation of the corrugated steel inner roof is now being done. This is the first step in enclosing the structure. We are thrilled with the progress, particularly in lieu of the inclement weather.

The contractor still plans to complete the museum building and hand us the keys on **June 30**. Allowing time to install the lighting, create the displays and select and position the cars, the Grand Opening is scheduled for September 28. This will coordinate with the CLC National Driving Tour that will begin in Indiana and end at Gilmore at the annual Cadillac Gathering weekend at Gilmore.

Other great news is that we just passed a milestone... \$1,000,000 in donations and pledges. But with expenses such as the architectural fees, site preparation, lighting costs in addition to the building construction costs of \$1,164,000 and the cost of displays, there is still a need to redouble our efforts to seek donations and pledges. The dream is becoming a reality...and the opportunity for each of us to become a part of it is now!

5. Operational components: Engine starts, lights, instruments, brakes, AC, radio, etc. in functioning condition: 20 points max.

TOTAL POSSIBLE: 100 Points There will be four trophies awarded: Two best survivors pre-1960 and two best survivors 1961 through 1984. **You may NOT enter your car in BOTH Survivor and another Class unless you pay two entry fees!**



For other trophies you must select the one class that best fits your car. If you're not sure, we will help. First place in each class will receive a nice trophy and second place will receive a ribbon.
