My Trip to Scottsdale, Arizona

I recently enjoyed a five-day trip to Scottsdale, Arizona, where I represented our region at the winter meeting of the CLC National Board. I arrived on Tuesday, January 13th, at around 11:30am Mountain Time. The flight took around five hours. Airfare is pretty reasonable, with a round trip running between \$250-\$320. A reasonable price to get away from the winter chill.

I stayed at the Scottsdale Plaza Hotel/Resort. The grounds are so large that golf cart service is provided between the main lobby and all of the rooms. Prices for goods and services are pretty high in the area, comparable to prices in our area.

On Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday I attended the Barrett Jackson, R&M, and Russo and Steele auctions. The quantity and quality of Cadillac and LaSalle cars at Barrett Jackson was quite poor. Some decent purchases can be had at Russo and Steele. I really liked this 1949 Series 61 Club Coupe (seen below) that was for sale. It sold for a little more than I would have been comfortable with: \$60,500!



There is no doubt that Barrett Jackson is the place to sell vehicles, as prices here can be double the retail price seen elsewhere. Russo and Steele has some decent buys and is a more friendly auction to walk through.

On Saturday, the board of directors meeting was held from 8am-3pm. Many subjects were discussed, including future locations for grand nationals and national driving tours. There are some changes in the CLC judging system coming, and it is my belief that they will bring a positive improvement to the current system.

Saturday evening I attended a cruise night a mile from the hotel. There were around 1,000 cars present. It was sunny that day with a high of 74 degrees. That's Dave Rubin (below, left) at the cruise at sunset. What a great way to end my trip out in sunny Arizona. I came back to Newark on Sunday, January 18th, at 1:30pm EST to a huge downpour. 2015 Driving Tour Registration Notes

Hotel - Somerset Inn, Troy, Michigan

This is a hub and spoke tour, we will be staying at the same hotel each night. Please see the registration form for the contact information. Please do not use other online services, we have rooms blocked and may not get credit for your reservation.

Important Note: This tour is during the week of the Woodward Dream Cruise, this is the largest one day automotive event in the world, rooms will be hard to find, please reserve early.

The hotel has plenty of onsite parking for your trailer and rig if you choose to do so. Hoses, buckets, towels and water will be provided by the hotel at no charge. You will need to supply your own cleaning products.

Tuesday

This Pre Tour event is for people coming into the area for the first time or not in a long time. The ticket price for Greenfield Village is \$22 per person. This includes our own parking area and entrance to the grounds. If you would like to do the Museum instead, it would be \$17 and parking will be in the general lot. We will need to know your preference before hand. Dinner is on your own. We will provide a list of recommended restaurants within the area of the hotel for every price range.

Wednesday

Departure 8:30 am

We will visit the GM Heritage Center, owned by General Motors and featuring past cars and trucks, experimental and show cars. The Center is not open to the public except in groups. Next, we are on to the General Motors Tech Center, which is not open to the public, our sponsor will take us on a rare tour inside the grounds. We will lunch at and tour the Edsel and Eleanor Ford House, then take a scenic drive back to the hotel. We will have dinner and see the sights along Woodward Avenue as the Dream Cruise event begins to take shape. Lunch and dinner are included in the price as are all events.

Thursday

Departure 8:30 am

Our longest drive will be on this day as we travel along Lake St. Clair and the St. Clair River to Port Huron. We will lunch on the shore of the river where Canada is just a stones throw away. Visit Wills Sainte Claire Auto Museum of Classic Autos in Marysville and the Fort Gratiot Lighthouse at the juncture of Lake Huron and the St. Clair River. Following the Museum and Lighthouse visits we will travel back to the hotel, stopping at the Troy Historic Village for ice cream and treats. Dinner will be near the hotel with plenty of time afterward for shopping or to head back to Woodward Avenue.

Friday

Departure 8:30 am

We will drive the nearby grounds of the Cranbrook Institute before we head up to Meadow Brook Hall, the former Dodge Mansion. After the tour we will have lunch and visit The Stahl Collection. Returning we will have our banquet at the hotel.

This is a post tour event for those that would like to stay for the Woodward Dream Cruise. You may tour a private collection of cars that few can rival. It takes up two buildings and will be a highlight. This event may be attended for a cost of \$5 per person.

For those that would like to take in the Dream Cruise we have rented a parking lot so you can come and go as well as display your car. It is at a local restaurant, so we have food and facilities handy. The cost of this event is \$35 for the cost of 1 car to park in the lot. There is no per person charge, there is no food included in the cost. We have limited spots available first come first served. The Dream Cruise concludes at 9 pm, the spot is yours for the entire day.


